

Our Program

Our home provides supportive and transitional housing for young women who are expecting a child or have a child. We help youth ages sixteen to twenty-one learn valuable life skills, attend school, and deal with the difficulties of growing up. Youth live in a supportive home environment designed to foster a sense of belonging by encouraging home participation.

Located in a historic Prince Albert home, Rendalyn Home provides safety and a nurturing home to encourage growth in both mother and child.

There is a common area containing a kitchen and a living area that is shared by residents. Laundry facilities, bedding, linen, and towels are provided. Staff are available twenty-four hours a day to ensure full youth support and supervision. Meals are often made together to promote cooking skills and friendships among youth.

Each youth meets with staff to design a plan for themselves moving forward. Case plans are individualized for each youth to ensure that the best outcomes are reached. It is at this point that youth may be referred to other community agencies, mental health services, and domestic violence supports. There are also services for assistance with resumes and job searches to help them enter the workforce.

Youth are provided with a lot of learning opportunities, including life-skills training which assists youth to transition into adult life. Some programs include traditional parenting, nutrition and cooking classes, and budgeting.

We also assist our youth to ensure they obtain education, and assist mothers with the complexities of the court system.

There are a variety of youth-centered activities and outings, such as crafts, camping, beach-trips, sports events, and more.

We ensure that all of our programming is culturally-sensitive and provide indigenous cultural activities.











Eligibility

Who can stay at Rendalyn Home? Youth involved with the Ministry of Social Services, and who are expecting a child or have children may be eligible to stay at Rendalyn Home. Youth ages sixteen to twenty-one are eligible for referral to the program.

All applications MUST be referred by the Ministry of Social Services. Each referral is reviewed and applications are accepted on a basis of suitability.

Not all applicants are accepted into the program.
